## I) READING COMPREHENSION

### A- THE TEXT

1. Off the coast of Isla Mujeres Bay in Cancun, Mexico, environmentalist and architect Richart Sowa lives comfortably on his island. It is made of over 150.000 recycled plastic water bottles connected to a bamboo frame, which is filled in with wood pellets and sand. Sowa built the island in 2005, but harsh weather destroyed it. On his third attempt of rebuilding his home — this time in calm waters — he succeeded in developing a **sturdy** home.

2. The three-storey house on Joyxee Island has solar panels, three showers, a kitchen, two bedrooms, a wave-powered washing machine and even Internet. After living on the island for several years alone, Sowa felt he was missing company in **his paradise** without anyone to share the island with him. In 2014, he met a famous Japanese supermodel over Facebook named Jodi Bowlin, and she was quick to adopt Sowa's simple lifestyle. "Living on the island looks like a **carefree** lifestyle, but there is a lot of physical work involved in keeping it up," said Bowlin in the Mirror. **The two** live on Joyxee together with a pet dog.

3. Sowa continues to improve the island, adding more and more features and slowly making Joyxee larger by putting more water bottles to the base. He intends to become completely self-sufficient as he still relies on parts of the mainland, including a 100 foot-long cord that connects to the shore to provide water and Internet. He makes a living through music, art and by showing interested tourists around the island in exchange for voluntary donations.
